In this session Haseman and Mclean demonstrate and discuss the workings and pedagogical outcomes of the prophetic.</p> <p>The prophetic is a form of applied theatre used in executive and corporate training and education to create bespoke client learning opportunities. It draws inspiration from two root words: prophecy (which foretells of possible future events) and hypothetical which is a proposition, “made as a basis of reasoning, without the supposition of truth”.</p> <p>The prophetic blends truth and fiction to present dramatic scenarios, which are reasoned speculations on the future.
